WHEREAS, the Town Council of the Town of Hounsfield has requested an agreement between the Town of Watertown Water District No. 1 and the Town of Hounsfield for the for the of Watertown Water District No. 1 to supply water to Hounsfield District No. 5, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the provisions of Article 12 of the Town Law and General Municipal Law Article 5c, the districts may enter into an agreement for the Town of Hounsfield District to draw water from the Town of Watertown District No. 1 and the Watertown District may fix prices so long as such action will not render the supply of water for the Watertown district or it's inhabitants insufficient, and

WHEREAS, under the terms and conditions set forth in a contract (attached as EXHIBIT A) to furnish up to 15,000 gallons of water per day, and

WHEREAS, a wheeling rent fee for each 748 gallons of water supplied to the Hounsfield District No. 5 has been established at .50 cents for each 748 gallons transported through the Town Water District No.1 infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, the terms and conditions set forth in the contractual agreement (attached as EXHIBIT A) have been approved by the Town Attorney and the Town Engineer.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Supervisor is hereby authorized by the Town of Watertown Council, acting as administrators of Town Water District No.1 to execute said agreement between the Town of Watertown Water District No.1 and the Town of Hounsfield Water District No. 5 for the transport of water to Hounsfield Water District No. 5.

Supervisor Bartlett moved to adopt the foregoing resolution and Councilman Rich seconded. Upon a roll call vote of the Town Board as follows the resolution was duly adopted.

WHEREAS, Bernier, Carr and Associates, the Town Engineering Firm has drafted a preliminary map, plan and report to address proposed infrastructure improvements in Town Sewer Districts Nos.2 and 3 and the property which encompasses County Route 202 to accommodate proposals for 800 units of housing, and

WHEREAS, the map plan and report also addresses future sewer capacity issues and allows for development in the area beyond the proposed housing development by increasing infrastructure pumping and transporting capacities to the City of Watertown waste treatment facility, and

WHEREAS, the map plan and report provides the Town Council with (three) 3 options for consideration to address the area sewer pumping and transporting issues, and

WHEREAS, the Town Engineers have recommended that option No. 2 of the map, plan and report be implemented as a means to address the sewer issues in Sewer District Nos. 2 and 3 and further recommends the creation of a new Sewer District No. 7 to service property's along County Route 202.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that in accordance with and pursuant to the Town of Watertown Town Planning Board action on Wednesday, September 7th, relative to the Town Planning Boards Negative Declaration under SEQR, for the COR Housing

Development project and the Morgan Community Housing Development project. The Town of Watertown Town Council hereby affirms it's desire to implement option No.2 of the Map, Plan and Report as recommended and submitted by the Town Engineers.
