TOWN BOARD MEMBERS

Supervisor Bartlett opened the meeting at 7:00 PM and called for a roll of members present. All members were present with the exception of Councilman Desormo. Legal Counsel Joseph W. Russell was present.

MOTION # 109

Supervisor Bartlett moved to adopt the minutes of the September 8, 2011 Regular Meeting. Councilman Smith seconded.

Supervisor Bartlett opened the floor to the public.

Mr. Dale Maitland, spoke representing his mother. Mrs. Maitland owns property on Brookside Drive, and is in the process of selling some of it to the town for the purpose of correcting the town right of way. Mr. Maitland stated that his mother could not afford the expense of obtaining an attorney to review the abstract and represent her at the closing.

Supervisor Bartlett, with the agreement of the Town Board, stated that the town attorney would represent Mrs. Maitland and the Town in the transaction.

No one else chose to address the board, therefore, Supervisor Bartlett closed the privilege of the floor.

Town Clerk's Correspondence:

A letter from Mrs. Jean Monroe regarding the cemetery on Ridge Road. She stated the cemetery needed mowing more often, and the fence repaired.

WHEREAS, the Town Council is in receipt of the final pay request submitted by Amstar of Western NY for infrastructure improvements on Water District No. 3 and 4 capital improvement project No. 2007-116, in the amount of \$13,200.00, and

MOTION # 114

WHEREAS, all municipalities including the Town of Watertown, have the power and authority to agreement for the purpose of renting, leasing, exchanging, borrowing or maintaining of machinery and equipment with or without operators, with other municipalities, and

WHEREAS, all municipalities including the Town of Watertown have the authority and power to borrow or lend materials and supplies to other municipals, and

WHEREAS, it is hereby determined that the Towns of Watertown and other municipalities have machinery and equipment which is not used during certain periods, and

WHEREAS, it is determined that the Town of Watertown and other municipalities often have materials and supplies on hand not immediately needed, and

WHEREAS, it is determined that municipalities may avoid the necessity of purchasing certain needed equipment and materials thereby saving taxpayers money, and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Town of Watertown to give the Highway Department Head the authority to enter into renting, exchanging, borrowing or lending or maintaining arrangements with the person serving in similar capacities in other municipalities without the approval of the Town of Watertown Council prior to making each individual arrangements, and

WHEREAS, a standard agreement (attached as Exhibit A) has been prepared and expected to be adopted in other municipalities and placed into effect and will grant the person holding the comparable position to that of the Highway Department Head authority to make similar arrangements, and

WHEREAS, it is determined that it will be in the best interests of the Town of Watertown to be a party to such shared service arrangements.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Chief Executive Officer of the Town of Watertown is hereby authorized to execute on behalf of the Town of Watertown, the attached Shared Highway Service Agreement.

Supervisor Bartlett moved the foregoing resolution and Councilman Rich seconded.

Discussion took place regarding the intent of the resolution and the depletion of materials, including sand and salt which may deplete the Town of Watertown's supply.

MOTION # 119

A purchase and sale agreement prepared by Joseph W. Russell, town attorney, was presented to the board, for the purchase of certain property owned by Mrs. Darlene Maitland and to be purchased by the Town of Watertown. (an approximately 1.529 acre parcel of vacant land situate on the South side of County Route 67 "Brookside Drive" in the Town of Watertown, Jefferson County, New York and identified on the latest completed assessment roll for the Town of Watertown as a part of tax parcel number 91.00-1-22 and more particularly described on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof. The purchase price to be paid by Purchaser for the property in the sum of Eleven Thousand and 00/100 Dollars "\$11,000.00 plus legal fees.

Therefore Supervisor Bartlett offered a motion to execute the agreement on behalf of the Town of Watertown. Seconded by Councilman Rich.

Discussion: Councilman Smith suggested that the town having used the property for several years should pay a rental fee for that use. Mr. Russell stated that the town could not pay additional monies for rental or usage fees. Supervisor Bartlett suggested that the Maitland's could present to Mr. Roger Tibbetts, Town Assessor, and/or the grievance board a case to reduce the amount of future taxes.

Supervisor Bartlett moved to amend the motion to include authorization and sign all closing documents as prepared. Councilman Prosser seconded the amendment.
