Councilman Desormo offered a prayer and Supervisor Bartlett led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Supervisor Bartlett moved to accept the minutes of the July 10, 2008 regular board meeting as presented. Councilman Prosser seconded.

MOTION # 89

Supervisor Bartlett offered a motion to schedule a special meeting of the town board for 7:00 PM, August 26, 2008 for the purpose of holding a public hearing on proposed bond resolution for improvements to Water District No. 6, (Norstar Housing Development). Councilman Rich seconded.

Supervisor Bartlett offered the floor to David Roof, president of the Town of Watertown Ambulance Service.

Mr. Roof presented to the board an update on the financial and service record of the ambulance service. He noted the number of ambulance calls made since the first of the year, and the increase in the number of volunteers and paid employees during that period. He presented to the board copies of the Town of Watertown Ambulance Service budget for January 1, 2009 thru December 31, 2009. He also requested in writing that the service would like to change to a calendar year operating budget effective January 1, 2009. He went on to explain that under the current agreement the town would pay to the ambulance service, \$50,000.00 on September 1, 2008 for the period of 9/1/08 thru 8/31/09. He requested that in lieu of the \$50,000.00, the town pay to the ambulance service \$16,800.00 on 9/1/08 for the period of 9/1/08 thru 12/31/08, which is the prorated amount of the \$50,000.00 for the period requested. He then suggested that the town agreement of \$50,000.00 per year be included in the town's fiscal year budget to cover the period of 1/1/09 thru 12/31/09. This represents a savings to the town of \$33,200.00 in the town's 2008 budget.

Supervisor Bartlett opened the floor for anyone wishing to address the town board.

Mrs. Peggy Raymond asked the status of her request at the last board meeting regarding the regulations of outdoor wood burning furnaces. She also commented that at the last board meeting she had made a comment regarding extension of water service to residents within the town. As a clarification, she is not opposed to an expansion of water service to people who have a shortage of water, she was only talking about her own situation where she has plenty of water.

Mrs. Raymond listed some changes she thought should be included in the outdoor wood burning furnace regulations.

Supervisor Bartlett informed her that the code enforcement officer had checked on the neighboring house to determine if it met the present code, and that his findings assured that it did meet code. In terms of the suggested changes, Supervisor Bartlett stated that he would refer her suggestions to the planning board.

Mr. William George requested that the board appoint him as marriage officer for the Town of Watertown under Section 11 of the New York State Domestic Relations Law.

Supervisor Bartlett stated that he would prepare a resolution for Mr. George's appointment for the August 26, 2008 board meeting.

No one else chose to address the board, Supervisor Bartlett closed the floor to the public.

Supervisor Bartlett acknowledged receipt of the Town Clerk's report for the Month of July 2008.

Supervisor Bartlett acknowledged receipt of the resignation of the Town of Watertown Justice Court Clerk Jackie Cronk effective August 31, 2008.

Supervisor Bartlett noted that there were no sand bids received and at the suggestion of Mr. Russell the town might want to look at the town highway superintendents association to see if they have any pool, whereby we might be able to get what we need for the coming winter requirements.

WHEREAS, the Town of Watertown proposes to replace approximately 2,000 lineal feet of 4" ductile iron pipe with 8" ductile iron pipe along NYS Route 11, to upgrade existing elevated storage tank and consolidate telemetry controls for the tank, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Watertown proposes to reallocate a portion of the flow from Sewer District No. 2 (Salmon Run Mall) to Sewer District No. 3 by installing approximately 2800 lineal feet of sewage transmission main within Salmon Run Mall and along Salmon Run Mall Drive to connect to the existing manhole within Sewer District No. 3 near Ryder Trucking, and
