WHEREAS, the town is in possession of a copy machine that is no longer needed for town purposes and is considered surplus equipment, and

WHEREAS, the City of Watertown operates a waste water treatment facility and provides sewage treatment for Town of Watertown Sewer Districts 2,3,4,5 and 6, and

WHEREAS, a new contract between the City of Watertown and the Town of Watertown for providing sewage treatment for Sewer District No. 6 has been negotiated with the City of Watertown that establishes the terms and conditions by which Sewer District No. 6 will be allowed to utilize the City sanitary sewer services for a term of five years commencing February 12, 2009.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Town Council of the Town of Watertown does hereby approve the contract as annexed hereto with the City of Watertown for providing sewage treatment for Sewer District No. 6 for a period of five years, commencing February 12, 2009 and it is further Resolved, that the Supervisor of the Town of Watertown is hereby authorized to execute all necessary documents with the City of Watertown to implement such agreement.

WHEREAS, the town water districts have certain backflow check valves in service located throughout the districts infrastructure, and

WHEREAS, it is mandated by the N.Y.S.D.O.H. that all backflow devices be tested and certified under the guidance of a backflow certified testing program on an annual basis, and

WHEREAS, Hyde-Stone Mechanical Contractors are the only certified contractors in the area who can provide the testing services and have submitted a proposal to provide said testing services for the Town Districts, said proposal attached as Exhibit A.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the service proposal submitted by Hide-Stone Mechanical Contractors is hereby approved under the terms and conditions contained within the agreement. And

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the supervisor is authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the Town of Watertown Water Districts.

WHEREAS, Jefferson County is in need of manpower, machinery and equipment in connection with the removal of snow and ice from county roads and bridges, and

WHEREAS, The Town of Watertown has the available manpower, machinery and equipment to meet the county's requirements and desires to provide such services for Jefferson County, and

WHEREAS, a contractual agreement attached as Exhibit A, has been negotiated between the Town of Watertown and Jefferson County containing the terms and conditions for the payment to the Town for providing said snow removal services for a period of one year commencing January 1, 2009 and expiring December 31, 2009.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, in consideration of the promises and covenants herein contained in the agreement, the Town Council of the Town of Watertown hereby approves the contractual agreement and authorizes the Supervisor to execute said agreement on behalf of the Town of Watertown.

MOTION #22

WHEREAS, the Watertown Brookside Cemetery Association, a not for profit corporation, owns property within the boundary of Water District3, Water District 4 and Sewer District 4 and has previously been apportioned and billed an advalorem tax to pay for existing debt service within the districts, and

WHEREAS, it has been determined by motion #37 adopted in 2008 that the value of the property was incorrectly billed by including the value of land in addition to the buildings assessed value, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to refund the portion of tax levied relating to land value as a portion of the assessment formula for the properties.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Supervisor is authorized to issue a refund of advalorum taxes received from the Watertown Cemetery Association in the amounts as follows:
